

## Seeing is Believing

Last week we explored how we see and things that help us see. We put two dimes in two cups and filled one cup with water. We put the dimes in the same place in each cup, where they were hidden by the sides of the cup. Then we moved toward the cups, to see if we could see one of the dimes before the other one. The same dime was seen by each person first.

The scriptures: **Job 28: 11 He searches the sources of the rivers and brings hidden things to light. Daniel 2:22 He reveals deep and hidden things; he knows what lies in darkness, and light dwells in him.** The better we know God, the better we can see things we can only see through him.

This week in Sunday School, we'll check out what has been growing in the classroom for the past seven days.

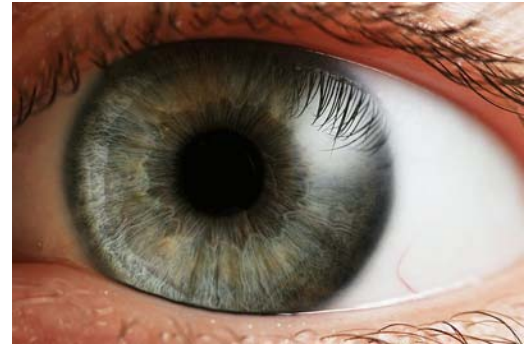
